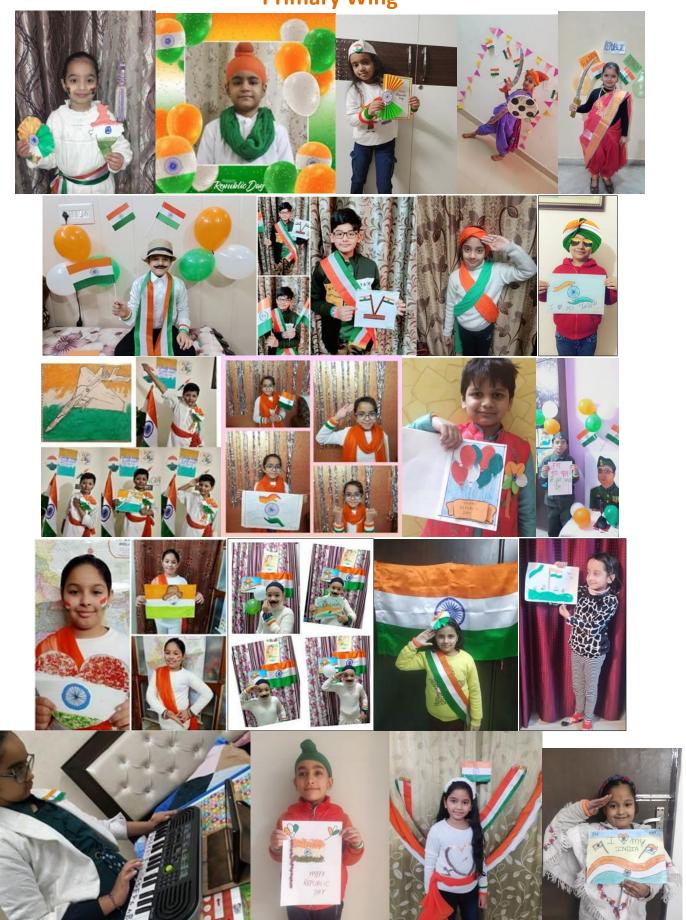
St. Cecilia's Public School Republic Day Celebration 2022 Primary Wing
